HISTORY - LEGISLATION

Federal Constitution of 1988

- The Federal Constitution of 1988 foresees the holding of elections abroad.

Eligibility criteria

- Brazilians;
- over 16 years old;
- enlisted at the local consular office;

The opening of an overseas polling station requires at least 30 registered voters

In-person voting only; Votes are for President and Vice-President

2022 ELECTIONS - ARRANGEMENTS

Role of embassies and consulates

- assisting the Electoral Justice in **registration** and **regularization** of voters
- **prospecting voting locations**
- **estimating costs**
- **publicizing** election dates and important announcements
- contacting **volunteers** and assisting with **training**
- years and months before the elections: **registration, regularization and transfer of voting titles**



2022 ELECTIONS - ARRANGEMENTS

Role of embassies and consulates

- ballot boxes are sealed, placed in **diplomatic bags** and sent over by airplane
- on average, arrival at polling stations **one month before** the election
- on the eve of the election, **assembly** of polling stations

2022 ELECTIONS – ELECTION DAY

Chief of Mission:

- administrative head, **highest authority** on the polling station

Itamaraty and Electoral Justice teams in Brazil:

- on duty to **answer questions** and **advise polling stations**

Embassies and consulates:

- send results to the **High Electoral Court**
- publicize results through the **ballot box report cards**

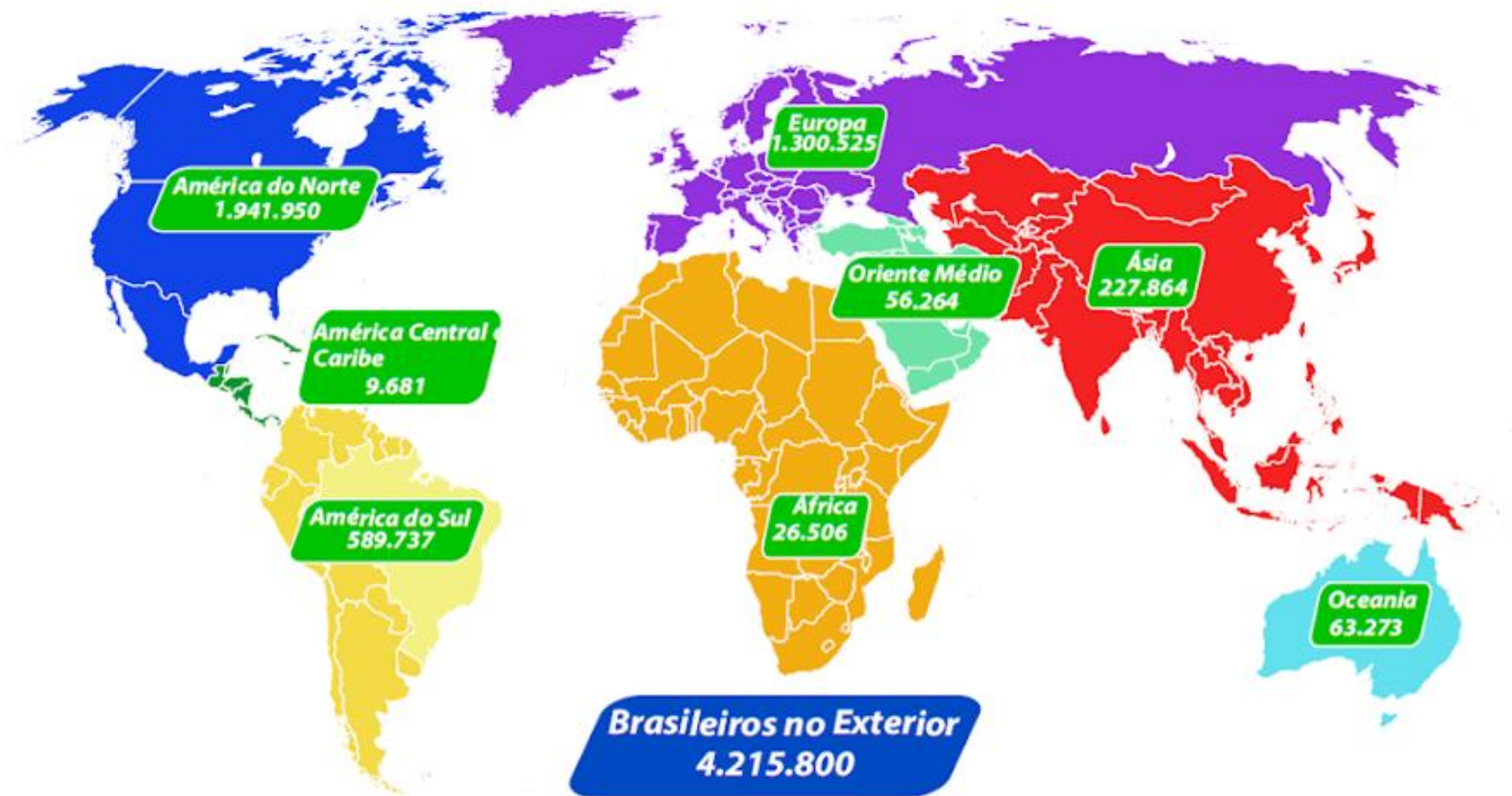

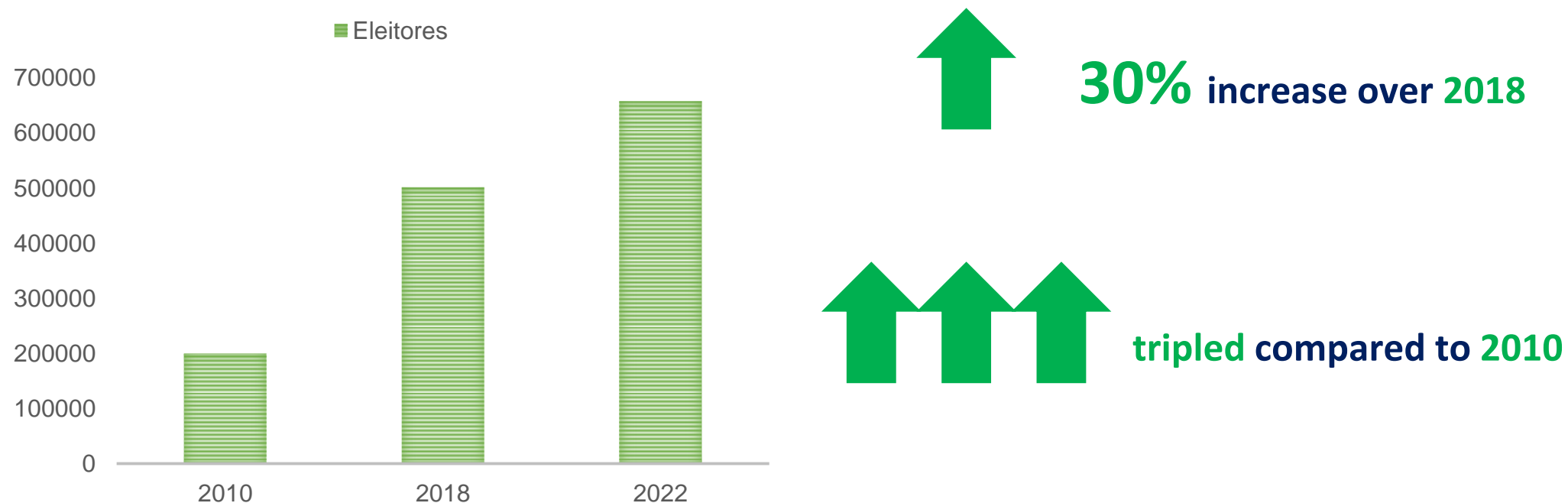


BRAZILIAN COMMUNITY ABROAD (2021)

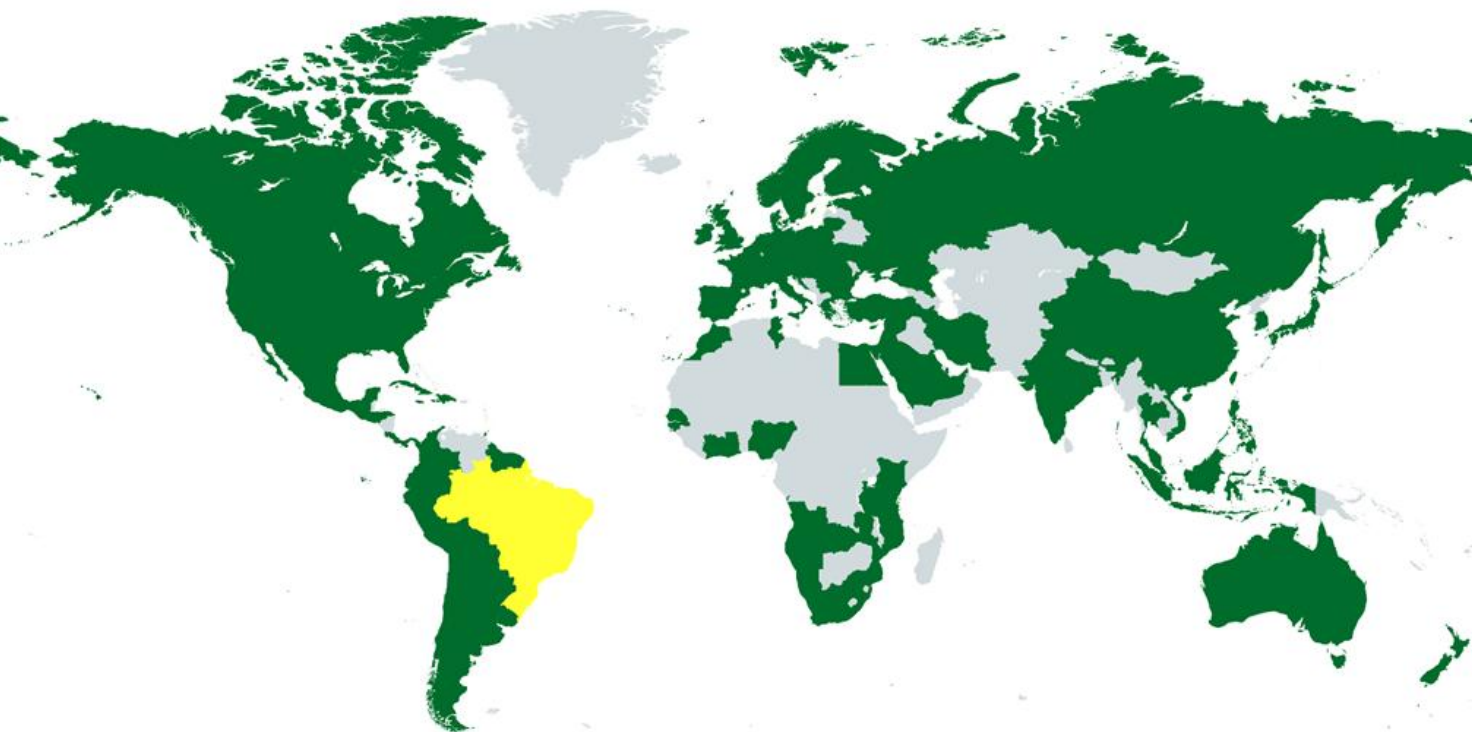

137 cities

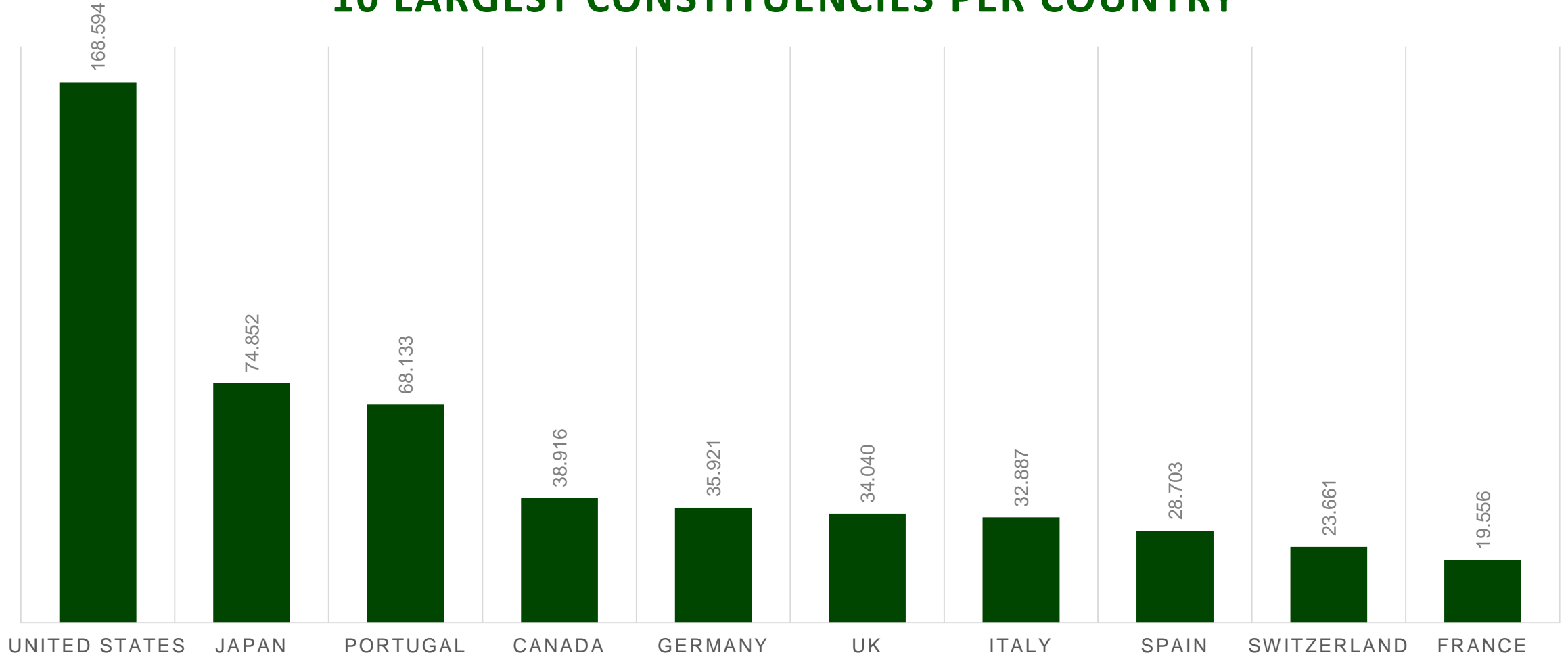
102 countries
